This Wisconsin Assistive Technology Initiative document provides a *Procedure Guide for Assistive Technology and Transition Planning*. The packet has a protocol that addresses the student's level of independence in daily living, use of transportation, tolerance, mobility, communication, computer access, literacy, and problem solving skills. There is also a section for addressing *AT Device Specific Skills*, as well as a section for *AT Management Skills* and *Goal Setting Skills*. The next section includes a portfolio for students who are transitioning that assists the team in collecting documentation for the portfolio on assistive technology.
